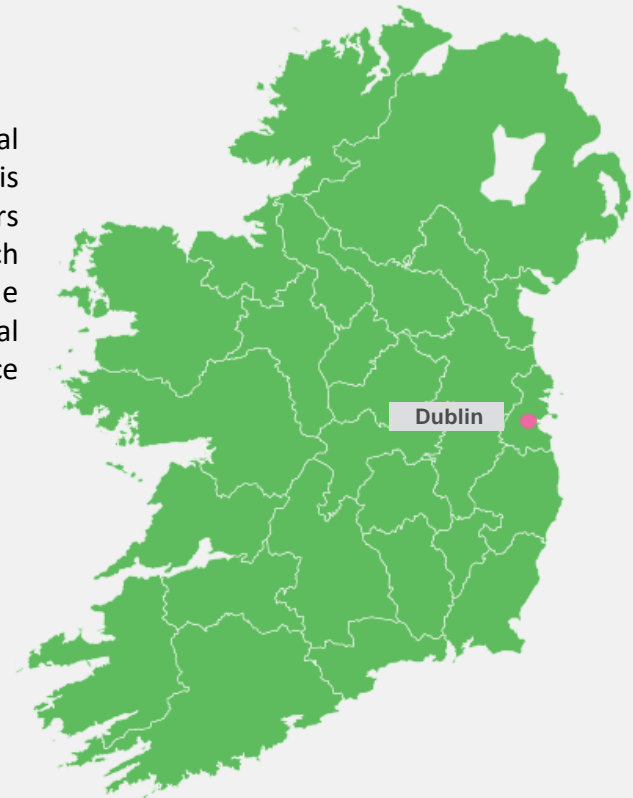

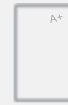

The Transition Year programme is a course devised by the coordinator in consultation with teaching staff.
