Location, Location

Our boarding houses are located on a 26-acre site in Haslemere's historic, charming market town. The school is surrounded by some of South East England's most beautiful countryside, much of which is owned by the National Trust. Located halfway between London and the South Coast, we ensure pupils visit nearby historical and cultural attractions as part of their stay with us.

Nestled between wooded hills in the south west corner of Surrey and surrounded by National Trust land, Haslemere is one of the gems of the Surrey Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and gateway town to the South Downs National Park. The town makes a great base for exploring the miles of beautiful rolling countryside, heathland, valleys, attractive market towns and picturesque villages. The rich and diverse landscape has helped to inspire many great artists and authors. Both visitors and residents are spoilt for choice as the Haslemere area provides the perfect countryside for all leisure and sporting activities.







Local Attractions

There are plenty of attractions in the surrounding area. Just 15 minutes walk from the school is the renowned Devil's Punchbowl, a large hollow of dry sandy heathland. The Punchbowl has a long history and tradition. Legend has it that the devil spent his time tormenting the god Thor by pelting him with enormous handfuls of earth, leaving the great bowl that visitors can see today. In reality the large depression was created by erosion as water percolated down and hit an impervious layer of clay. A large number of small springs sprung up across the area as the water pressure built up. The hollow is overlooked by the 894 feet Gibbet Hill, the second highest hill in Surrey.

Just 10 minutes away from the school is Haslemere station, with direct trains straight to London Waterloo.

The Royal School is ideal for parents wanting a wholesome, safe environment for pupils that is close enough to London to experience the culture and magnificence of our capital.

Qualifications that count



English language learners work towards internationally recognised qualifications, including Cambridge University Language Assessment Examinations IGCSE in Year 10 & 11 in English as a Second Language and IELTS in Year 12 & 13).














Year 11 - One-Year GCSE

A one-year GCSE course is the international equivalent of a GCSE but is offered in one academic year. The one-year GCSE gives pupils the ability to gain the pass grades they need to apply for A levels and/or BTECs in just one year. The course is also suitable for those international pupils who wish to study A levels but who first need an introduction to the British curriculum, seen as a pre-A level course.

Over the course of one year, learners study up to six GCSEs, depending on ability.

The programme includes:

- Joining Year 11 in September of each year
- Year 11 form group
- GCSEs in up to six subjects: maths, English as an Additional Language (EAL), native language (if offered), further maths (for the most able mathematicians), a science, geography
- Games and PE lessons
- Future Ready lessons
- EAL lessons with highly experienced specialist teachers
- British Culture Programme
- PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education)/RSE (Relationships & Sex Education)



Additional qualifications that could be gained are:

- Arts Award
- LAMDA
- Duke of Edinburgh



A home-from-home

For some boarders, this may be the first experience of living away from home, and we understand it can take some time to adjust to boarding life. However, our experienced boarding staff are on hand to make this transition seamless, offering support and advice to pupils and parents alike.

We provide a secure and stable environment where we support and encourage pupils. There is always plenty to do, friends to spend time with and events to look forward to. As with the rest of the school, the boarding house is underpinned by a strong pastoral ethos, with someone on hand for guidance, encouragement and support, just like home. Prince of Wales Boarding House

Our junior boarding house is located in Stoatley Hall, a majestic grade II listed building dating back to 1900. It is home to all our Year 7-10 boarders. Spacious rooms in Prince of Wales accommodate two to four pupils.

The boarding house is split into different areas for different age groups. Each floor has its own toilet and showering facilities and there is a common room on each floor as well as an equipped kitchen. Junior boarders from Year 9 can use the gym, supervised, in the evenings and at weekends. They can also use the kitchen in the Nelson Café to cook with our GAP students or the member of staff on duty at weekends. Boarders are encouraged to personalise their bedrooms with pictures, posters and photographs.







QEII Boarding House

Our Queen Elizabeth II (QEII) Boarding House was opened in 1989 by our late Patron, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. QEII provides a home-from-home for Year 11-13 boys and girls that board with us. It comprises single and double study bedrooms. Each boarder has their own furnished area, including a bed, wardrobe, drawers and a desk. In addition, there is a large and comfortable common room where pupils can relax and socialise. Kitchenette facilities (complete with a kettle, toaster, fridge, etc.) are available to make evening snacks, with staff on hand to supervise where necessary. There is also a fully equipped gym onsite. It has captive weights machines, cross-trainers, Concept2 rowers, treadmills, barbells and bikes. Pupils can also make use of our tennis/basketball courts, and a full-size sports hall.

The girls' rooms are on the top floor and boys' rooms are on the ground floor.
