All successful applicants will receive an official offer.

RECOMMENDATION

Those who are referred to a more suitable entry point/course/school will be given that option – they will have to interview accordingly

A TYPICAL MILL HILL SCHOOL CANDIDATE

A typical candidate should have a strong academic profile (equivalent of GCSE grades 6's and 7's as a minimum for A Level applicants), a good level of English (High B2/C1 minimum) with a mature and independent character.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

There are no fixed deadlines for international applicants - Class size, boarding spaces and subject choice are limiting factors.
